

Workshops for FY 2014 Water Quality Financial Assistance

The Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) will hold workshops to provide information about the state's combined water quality grant and loan funding cycle and to review the FY (state fiscal year) 2014 application for the following funding sources:

- Washington State Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund.
- Centennial Clean Water Program.
- Federal Clean Water Act Section 319 Nonpoint Source Fund.

If you attend, you will get the most up-to-date information on the funding cycle and how to apply. You can speak with the experts from Ecology and get answers to your questions about the application process.

Who can apply for funding?

Public entities, including local governments, conservation districts, quasi-municipal corporations, federally recognized Indian tribes, institutions of higher education, and nonprofit organizations.

What are eligible project types?

Eligible projects to improve and protect Washington's water quality and including: Wastewater treatment, stormwater facilities and activities, nonpoint source pollution remediation, on-site septic repair and replacement.
