If we determine there is significant interest during this comment period to hold a hearing, we will:

- Extend the comment period to allow at least 30 days notice of the hearing.

Permit

Simpson operates a pulp and paper mill that discharges to Inner Commencement Bay in Tacoma. Under state and federal law, a NPDES permit is required to discharge this wastewater.

Simpson's permit was last issued November 15, 2008. There are no significant changes proposed other than an electronic data submittal requirement. The permit fact sheet contains more information.

Waste 2 Resources Program

A NPDES permit is normally issued every five years. It:

- Sets limits on the kinds, amounts and concentrations of pollutants a facility may release.
- Requires a facility to measure, test and report its pollutants.
- Prescribes "best management practices."
- Sets other legal conditions necessary to discharge wastewater.

Effective comments:

- Tell us how well, based on current laws, rules and regulations, the proposed permit protects receiving water.
- Provide input on limits, conditions and requirements.
- Let us know if you think we made errors interpreting state and federal permitting requirements.
- Are specific. Tell us specifically what your concern is and how you think the permit should change.

When the comment period ends, Ecology will review and consider all comments received and make appropriate changes to the permit before issuing it.

Facility information

Simpson Tacoma Kraft operates a Kraft pulp and paper mill at 801 Portland Avenue, Tacoma, WA. Currently employing about 400 people, the mill produces bleached and unbleached packaging grade paper, linerboard, and unbleached kraft pulp. Average production is 1400 tons per day.
