What is the Clean Water State Revolving Fund?

The Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) is an innovative program for financing a range of water quality improvement projects. Under this program, Washington State makes low-interest loans to public entities such as counties, cities, towns, special purpose districts, and tribes. SRF loans can fund planning, design, and implementation of a variety of agriculture, rural, and community best management practices.

What activity projects are eligible?

Loan applicants must demonstrate that the project will have significant water quality benefits. Examples of best management practices eligible for funding with an SRF loan include:

- **On farm irrigation efficiency**
- **Canal lining and piping**
- **Riparian/wetland restoration, protection, and land acquisition**
- **Onsite septic repair or replacement**
- **Direct seed drill purchase**
- **Stormwater filtration**

WHY IT MATTERS

The state's low-interest SRF loans can help public entities pay for a variety of actions on the ground to improve, protect and restore water quality.
