## Chapter 173-900 WAC

# **Electronic Products Recycling Program**

The Department of Ecology proposes to amend Chapter 173-900 WAC, Electronic Products Recycling Program. The rule proposal will be published in the Washington State Register on November 4, 2015.

### What is the purpose of this rule proposal?

The purpose of this proposal is to revise the rules for the Electronic Products Recycling Program to address changes made by the 2013 Legislature to the underlying law (RCW 70.95N).

The rule proposes using a market-share (current sales) based system to determine each manufacturer's responsibility to the program, and ultimately, the fees manufacturers are responsible for paying to the stewardship organization.

The rule expands the reporting requirements for organizations operating recycling programs for electronic products to include:

- An estimate of each type of material recovered from the recycling of electronics including:
  - Cathode ray tube glass
  - Circuit boards
  - Batteries
  - Mercury-containing devices
  - Plastics
  - o Metals
- An estimate of the weight of all collected products that are ultimately reused, recycled, or end up as residual waste that is disposed.
- A description of program revenues and costs for education and promotional efforts, collection, transportation, processing and labor, and program administration.
- A description of the methods used to collect, transport and process covered products.
- Clarifying that retailers of covered electronic products must provide take-home information on electronics recycling. Posting a sign at the checkout stand does not meet the requirement.
