Public Participation Plan Available for Public Review

Ecology has finalized a public participation plan for the West of 4th site in Seattle. The plan is a requirement of the West of 4th site's agreed order, which governs the performance of a feasibility study and the drafting of a cleanup action plan.

Groundwater contamination in an area west of Fourth Avenue S., south of South Lucile St., and north of the Duwamish Waterway's Slip 2 was investigated separately by four companies beginning in 2008. In 2014, these four companies signed an agreed order with Ecology to jointly perform a feasibility study and draft a cleanup action plan. Commingled groundwater contamination includes the hazardous substances trichloroethene, dichloroethenes, and vinyl chloride. In the northern area of the site, groundwater contamination also includes nickel and other toxic metals.

Negotiations Extended for Draft Cleanup Action Plan and Consent Decree

Ecology began negotiations on October 16, 2014, with Holcim (US) Inc. and the City of Spokane Valley for a draft cleanup action plan and consent decree. Negotiations originally were set for 60 days, but were extended. They were expected to be completed on Jan. 16, 2015. Ecology anticipates the completion of draft documents soon; a public comment period will begin once the drafts are finalized.

The draft cleanup action plan evaluates cleanup options for the site and identifies Ecology's preferred cleanup actions. The consent decree is the legal agreement between Ecology, Holcim (US) Inc. and the City of Spokane Valley that implements the draft cleanup action plan. Both of these documents are draft until Ecology reviews, considers and potentially amends the documents, if appropriate, based on public comment received during the comment period.

The site was previously used for cement manufacturing operations. Cleanup work focuses on the cement kiln dust (CKD) contamination which is a by-product of the cement manufacturing. The cleanup work is necessary because cement kiln dust (CKD) remains in two locations on the property. CKD is found on the Holcim property on the north plateau portion of the land. A smaller deposit is located north of the fence on property owned by the city.

CKD generally may contain arsenic, cadmium, and lead, and can have a high pH. The property is close to the Spokane River and aquifer. Past studies found arsenic in groundwater at levels that exceeded state standards.

NEWS & NOTES

Ecology publishes Port Gardner Bay regional background report

Port Gardner Bay in Everett is one of several embayments identified for focused sediment investigation and cleanup under Ecology's Puget Sound Initiative. As part of this effort, Ecology recently published the Port Gardner Bay regional background data report.

In early 2013, Ecology revised its Sediment Management Standards to establish a new framework for identification and cleanup of contaminated sediment sites (Washington Administrative Code [WAC] 173-204). A key component of this framework was the concept of regional background sediment concentrations, which could potentially serve as the Cleanup Screening Level for sediment sites. This is the final report with a data summary and regional background values for select chemicals.

The report is called the Port Gardner Bay Regional Background Data Evaluation and Summary Report, publication no. 14-09-339.

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GLOSSARY

Agreed order - A legal agreement with Ecology to make sure the cleanup meets the standards of Washington State's cleanup law, the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA).

Cleanup action plan (CAP) - A document that describes the selected cleanup method(s) and specifies cleanup standards and other requirements. It is based on information and technical analyses generated during the RI/FS and consideration of public comments and community concerns. A draft of the CAP (DCAP) is made available for public review and comment before finalizing.

Comment period - A time period during which the public can review and comment on various documents and Ecology or EPA actions. For example, a comment period is provided to allow community members to review and comment on proposed cleanup action alternatives and proposed plans. Also, a comment period is held to allow community members to review and comment on draft feasibility studies.

Consent decree - A formal legal agreement that is filed with a court. It describes studies and/or cleanup work to be done at a site and the terms under which that work is to be done.

Engineering design report - Engineering design reports outline the specific details for implementation and operation of the first phase of the cleanup actions.

ERTS - Environmental Report Tracking System

Five-year periodic review - A periodic review is conducted at least every five years after the initiation of a cleanup action at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions, after cleanup is considered complete, and to ensure protection of human health and the environment.

Hazardous Sites List - A statewide list of contaminated properties. Ecology may remove a site from the list only after determining that all remedial actions except confirmational monitoring have been completed and compliance with the cleanup standards has been

achieved at the site, or the listing was erroneous.

Independent cleanup action - Any remedial action without department oversight or approval and not under an order or decree.

LUST - Leaking Underground Storage Tank

NFA - No Further Action

Public participation plan - Outlines and describes the tools Ecology will use to inform the public about site activities, and it identifies opportunities for the community to become involved in this process.

PSI - Puget Sound Initiative

RCW - Revised Code of Washington

Remedial action - Construction work done to clean up a contaminated site.

Remedial investigation/feasibility study - Two distinct but related studies. They are usually performed at the same time, and together referred to as the "RI/FS."

RI/FS - See Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study

SEPA - State Environmental Policy Act

Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) - An assessment to gather information about a site to confirm whether a release of hazardous substances has occurred and to enable Ecology to evaluate the relative potential hazard posed by the release.

UST - Underground Storage Tank

UXO - Unexploded Ordnance

Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) - The VCP is one of several options for cleaning up a hazardous waste site under the state's cleanup law. Under this option, property owners may perform a cleanup independently and request services from Ecology for a fee.

WAC - Washington Administrative Code

WARM, Washington Ranking Method - The method used to rank sites placed on the Hazardous Sites List.
