Chapter 173-224-WAC – Wastewater Discharge Permit Fees

What is Chapter 173-224 WAC and why is it being updated?

Chapter 173-224 established a fee system for state waste discharge and National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits. The state uses wastewater and stormwater permits as primary tools to protect clean water.

This rule is being amended to update the annual fees for wastewater and stormwater discharge permits. These permit fees are reviewed and updated every two years as needed to meet the requirements of RCW 90.48.465.

Summary of the rule changes adopted on November 18, 2015

After the completion of a public rulemaking process, Ecology has amended wastewater and stormwater discharge permit fees for state fiscal years 2016 (July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016) and 2017 (July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017). Fee categories were also created for Ecology's new Bridge Washing, In-Water Vessel Deconstruction, and Wineries permits.

Whom does this rule affect?

Ecology will assess permit fee increases as described on page 2 of this notice. Underpaying categories include those permits whose annual fees don't cover the department's costs for permit administration. Overpaying categories include those permits whose annual fees are in excess of the department's costs for related permit administration. Ecology is also adding three new fee categories that will include Bridge Washing, In-water Vessel Deconstruction, and Wineries – General Permits.

King County DNR Wastewater Treatment will have fees increased by 4.22% for State Fiscal Year 2016 and 4.19% for State Fiscal Year 2017.
