Comment period: September 9 - October 13, 2016

The Department of Ecology (Ecology) invites you to comment on the:

- Revised draft Air Operating Permit (AOP) for the former Weyerhaeuser Longview pulp and paper mill (now Nippon Dynawave).
- New North Pacific Paper Corporation (NORPAC) AOP.
- New Weyerhaeuser NR Co. Lumber mill AOP.

The initial comment period on Weyerhaeuser Longview's permit ended March 31, 2016. It contains requirements for the kraft pulp and paper mill, NORPAC's thermomechanical/deink pulp and paper mill, and the lumber/log operations. With the sale of the kraft mill to Nippon, and the pending sale of NORPAC, the permit now needs to split into three separate permits.

Changes to the permit

The main purpose of the comment period is to separate the requirements from the Weyerhaeuser permit into three permits. None of the limits on allowed air pollution have changed. No increase in pollution is allowed.

Changes made to Nippon's permit as a result of the earlier comment period include:

- Adding the recently adopted Maximum Achievable Control Technology regulations for boilers.
- Venting allowed from the pulp making process are not longer exempt during startup, shutdown and malfunction periods.
- Adding new greenhouse gas limits.

More information on changes are available in each proposed permit's Statement of Basis.

Commenting

- Are specific. Tell us what your concern is and how you think the permit(s) should change.
- Are focused. Refer to the conditions and requirements in the permit(s).
- Relate to the potential impacts to air quality from this action. Where possible, describe the state or federal rules and regulations you think have not been applied correctly.

When the comment period ends, we will review all comments received and make appropriate changes before finalizing the documents.

Facility information

Nippon, Longview is a kraft pulp and paper mill located at 3401 Industrial Way in Longview. Liquid packaging paper and extruder operations also take place. The mill produces approximately 830 off-machine tons of bleached paperboard and 365 air-dried tons of wet lap pulp each day.

NORPAC is located at 3001 Industrial Way in Longview. It produces newsprint and printing and specialty papers using thermomechanical pulp, deinked pulp from recycled newsprint, and bleached pulp from Nippon's Longview mill.

Weyerhaeuser Lumber Mill is located at 1999 Industrial Way in Longview. Operations include the saw and planer mills, lumber drying kiln, log truck shop, and log yard and export activities.
