Second Periodic Review Draft Report Available for Public Review and Comment Ecology invites you to review and comment on the second periodic review for the Columbia East Commercial Park site. We conduct a periodic review at least every five years after beginning cleanup at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions and to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment when institutional controls are used as part of a cleanup.

The site is owned by the City of Pasco, lies within an industrial park, and is currently undeveloped. Investigations in the late 1990s and early 2000s revealed that the site was used as a solid waste landfill where debris were incinerated. Soil sampling showed that contamination at the former burn sites meets levels allowed for industrial use. A restrictive covenant filed in 2001 records that the site is limited to industrial use. Ecology visited the site March 17, 2015, and found the cleanup actions appear to continue to be protective of human health and the environment.

Ecology will review comments received during the comment period and make recommendations for suggested changes. The periodic review will become final if no significant changes are made. An additional public comment period will be held if significant changes are made.

Site Proposed for Removal from Hazardous Sites List

Ecology proposes to remove the Broadview Service site from the Hazardous Sites List. The site is located at 12250 Greenwood Ave. N in Seattle. The site had been contaminated with petroleum substances and was cleaned up during 1990 to 1995 by the property owners. The cleanup actions accomplished at that time were evaluated by Ecology through the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP). Ecology added the property to the Hazardous Sites List in 2013.

The site underwent a Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) and was ranked a 3 under the Washington Ranking Method. The ranking uses a scale of 1 to 5, where 1 represents the highest risk and 5 represents the lowest risk. This ranking estimates the potential threat to human health and the environment relative to other sites at that time in Washington.

The property was used for an automobile fueling and repair service station from 1923 until 1990. There were nine underground storage tanks that stored mostly gasoline, and small quantities of waste oil and heating oil. The facility included dispenser islands and a building that housed three service bays with hydraulic hoists, a workshop, and office space. Petroleum products associated with the operations of the facility were released into the soil and define the site.

The facility was demolished in 1990. Petroleum contamination in soil was discovered during removal of the underground storage tanks and reported to Ecology on March 1, 1990. Cleanup actions were performed on the property during 1990 to 1995. All structures of the facility were demolished and removed from the property including the underground storage tanks and service building.

The contaminated soil then was excavated (2,450 cubic yards) and stockpiled on the property. The excavated soil was subsequently treated over time on the property to remove the contamination utilizing soil-vapor extraction and land farming remediation methods. Confirmation samples collected from the excavation and also during the subsequent treatment of the excavated soil demonstrated that

the soil contamination on the property were below state cleanup standards.

A three-story apartment building (Daniel Apartments) was built on the property during 1995. The building also includes a business office at street level, and a single-level underground parking garage. Ecology determined the site meets state cleanup standards for soil protective of human health and the environment. Ecology is proposing to delist this site from the Hazardous Sites List.

Extension of Feasibility Study Report Due Date

On October 30, 2015, Ecology sent a letter of approval for a later due date for a draft feasibility study (FS) report for the West of 4th site. The date has extended from mid-December to late January. Capital Industries was still performing fieldwork in late 2015.

Extending the due date to take into account their fieldwork schedule will improve the comprehensiveness of the FS report. Also, the federal Environmental Protection Agency recently proposed a new rule-making process for Washington state surface water quality standards. If these standards change after the FS report is submitted, major re-work may be needed before the cleanup action plan (CAP) can be prepared.

During the fall of 2015 the West of 4th potential liable parties (PLPs) evaluated the proposed water quality standards and met with Ecology on several occasions to discuss their potential impact on the FS. These evaluations and meetings delayed progress on preparing the draft FS report.

Responsive Summary Available

Ecology is providing a responsive summary from a public comment period for the Unocal Edmonds Bulk Fuel Terminal site at 11720 Unoco Road in Edmonds. The terminal operated from 1923 to 1991. Unocal is a subsidiary of Chevron Corporation, and the cleanup is being done by Chevron Environmental Management Company.

A number of Interim Actions have been conducted over the years to clean up oil floating on groundwater, remove arsenic-contaminated soil, and remove petroleum-contaminated soil. Removal of petroleum-contaminated soil resulted in cleanup of groundwater. Most of the site is now clean. Ecology certified the Upper Yard was suitable for residential use in 2003 and Point Edwards Condominiums were subsequently constructed.

Additional Interim Actions will begin in 2016 to clean up two remaining areas of contamination. One is the stormwater Detention Basin 2 Area and other is the vicinity of a Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) storm drain crossing the site. These areas are in the Lower Yard of the Terminal, the flat area below the Point Edwards Condominiums Cleanup activities will begin in 2016.

Public comment was accepted on the proposed interim action in August 2015. Ecology has considered all comments received. Ecology's responses to the comments is in the Responsiveness Summary, 2015 Interim Action Work Plan, dated December 11, 2015.

Second Periodic Review Draft Report Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology invites you to review and comment on the second periodic review for the Spokane Custom Wood Treating site. We conduct a periodic review at least every five years after beginning cleanup at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions and to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment when institutional controls are used as part of a cleanup.

Spokane Custom Wood Treating preserved lumber with chemicals from the mid-1970s through 1996. Soil at the site was contaminated with pentachlorophenol, diesel, and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons. Cleanup was conducted under the Voluntary Cleanup Program from 1998 to 2004, and included disposing of hazardous wastes and excavating contaminated soil. An estimated 1,531 cubic yards of contaminated soil remains because excavation would have risked the structural integrity of a neighboring building.

Engineering controls, including impervious asphalt and concrete surface covers and stormwater management systems, contain and isolate residual affected soil. The property is now Iron Bridge Office Campus, and a restrictive covenant prohibits any disturbance of the ground surface. Ecology visited the site January 21, 2015, and found no evidence of excavation or other ground disturbance.

Ecology will review comments received during the comment period and make recommendations for suggested changes. The periodic review will become final if no significant changes are made. An additional public comment period will be held if significant changes are made.

Periodic Review Draft Report Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology invites you to review and comment on the periodic review for the Spokane River Upriver Dam and Donkey Island site. We conduct a periodic review at least every five years after beginning cleanup at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions and to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment when institutional controls are used as part of a cleanup.

The Spokane River drains more than 4,900 square miles in Washington and Idaho. Mining operations, industries, and municipal wastewater treatment plants located within the watershed upstream of the site have discharged PCBs (polychlorinated biphenyls), creating deposits above Upriver Dam and in a channel on the northern side of Donkey Island.

The two deposits were investigated and cleaned up from 2003 to 2007. The Upriver Dam deposit was covered with a protective cap, and the Donkey Island deposit was excavated, backfilled with clean soil, and replanted. Ecology used data from sediment samples taken in 2008 and 2010 to determine the remedies are still effective.

Second Periodic Review Draft Report Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology invites you to review and comment on the second periodic review for the US Army COE Motor Pool site. We conduct a periodic review at least every five years after beginning cleanup at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions and to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment when institutional controls are used as part of a cleanup.

The site was formerly a US Army COE motor pool facility. Soil and groundwater at the site were contaminated with benzene, lead, and gasoline-range petroleum hydrocarbons. Cleanup was conducted under the Independent Remedial Action Program from 1992 to 1996, and included excavating three underground tanks that stored gasoline, which leaked and contaminated soil.

Excavation of contaminated soil was stopped due to potential fire and explosion hazard in a confined space. Institutional controls, including prohibition of groundwater use, contain and isolate residual affected soil and groundwater. Pacific Power now stores materials and maintains equipment at the property. Ecology visited the site January 14, 2015, and found the current site use and cleanup remedies are still protective of human health and the environment.

Ecology will review comments received during the comment period and make recommendations for suggested changes. The periodic review will become final if no significant changes are made. An additional public comment period will be held if significant changes are made.

GLOSSARY

Agreed order - A legal agreement with Ecology to make sure the cleanup meets the standards of Washington State's cleanup law, the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA).

Cleanup action plan (CAP) - A document that describes the selected cleanup method(s) and specifies cleanup standards and other requirements. It is based on information and technical analyses generated during the RI/FS and consideration of public comments and community concerns. A draft of the CAP (DCAP) is made available for public review and comment before finalizing.

Comment period - A time period during which the public can review and comment on various documents and Ecology or EPA actions. For example, a comment period is provided to allow community members to review and comment on proposed cleanup action alternatives and proposed plans. Also, a comment period is held to allow community members to review and comment on draft feasibility studies.

Consent decree - A formal legal agreement that is filed with a court. It describes studies and/or cleanup work to be done at a site and the terms under which that work is to be done.

Engineering design report - Engineering design reports outline the specific details for implementation and operation of the first phase of the cleanup actions.

ERTS - Environmental Report Tracking System

Five-year periodic review - A periodic review is conducted at least every five years after the initiation of a cleanup action at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions, after cleanup is considered complete, and to ensure protection of human health and the environment.

Hazardous Sites List - A statewide list of contaminated properties. Ecology may remove a site from the list only after determining that all remedial actions except confirmational monitoring have been completed and compliance with the cleanup standards has been achieved at the site, or the listing was erroneous.

Independent cleanup action - Any remedial action without department oversight or approval and not under an order or decree.

LUST - Leaking Underground Storage Tank

NFA - No Further Action

Public participation plan - Outlines and describes the tools Ecology will use to inform the public about site activities, and it identifies opportunities for the community to become involved in this process.

PSI - Puget Sound Initiative

RCW - Revised Code of Washington

Remedial action - Construction work done to clean up a contaminated site.

Remedial investigation/feasibility study - Two distinct but related studies. They are usually performed at the same time, and together referred to as the "RI/FS."

RI/FS - See Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study

SEPA - State Environmental Policy Act

Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) - An assessment to gather information about a site to confirm whether a release of hazardous substances has occurred and to enable Ecology to evaluate the relative potential hazard posed by the release.

UXO - Unexploded Ordnance

Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) - The VCP is one of several options for cleaning up a hazardous waste site under the state's cleanup law. Under this option, property owners may perform a cleanup independently and request services from Ecology for a fee.

WAC - Washington Administrative Code

WARM, Washington Ranking Method - The method used to rank sites placed on the Hazardous Sites List.
