Agreed Order, Scope of Work and Public Participation Plan Available for Public Review and Comment Ecology's Toxics Cleanup Program entered into an agreed order with Tesoro Companies, Inc. (Tesoro). The order requires Tesoro to conduct a supplemental remedial investigation and feasibility study at the Chevron Pipe Line Company Pasco Bulk Terminal site. The order includes a scope of work and public participation plan.

The supplemental remedial investigation will provide answers about petroleum contaminants in soil and groundwater, and define where contamination is located at the site. The feasibility study will identify and evaluate the best methods to clean up the contamination. The scope of work outlines the activities required by the order. The public participation plan outlines ways Ecology will involve and inform the public about cleanup at the site.

The site is located on the Snake River and has been a bulk fuel storage facility since 1950. In 1976, a release of about 28,000 gallons of petroleum was reported. Since then, previous owner Chevron documented 10 additional petroleum releases. Of these post-1976 releases, two were over 1,000 gallons.

#### Draft Periodic Review Report Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology invites you to review and comment on the periodic review for the Priceless Gas site. We conduct a periodic review at least every five years after beginning cleanup at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions and to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment when institutional controls are used as part of a cleanup.

The site is currently occupied by an espresso stand but was previously a gas station. Due to a leaking underground storage tank that has since been removed, petroleum products are in soil and groundwater at the site. A restrictive covenant filed in 2003 limits any activity that would expose humans or the environment to site contamination. An air-sparge/soil-vapor-extraction system has been removing soil contaminants since 2005. Two bioremediation amendments were applied in 2015 to degrade contamination in groundwater. Ecology visited the site November 2, 2015, and found the cleanup actions appear to continue to protect human health and the environment.

Ecology will review comments received during the comment period and make recommendations for suggested changes. The periodic review will become final if no significant changes are made. An additional public comment period will be held if significant changes are made.

Draft Cleanup Action Plan and Consent Decree Available for Review and Comment

Ecology invites you to review and comment on a draft Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) and Consent Decree (CD) for the McFarland Cascade Pole site. The Cleanup Action Plan identifies preferred cleanup methods and specifies cleanup standards and other requirements at the site.

The CD is a legal agreement between Ecology and the McFarland Cascade Pole facility to protect human health and the environment. Actions outlined in the CD and CAP include:

- Continued operation of the groundwater recovery system.
- Long-term monitoring and oversight.
- Applying a deed restriction to the property to make sure the facility will not be used for residential land use in the future.

If periodic review of the site shows a risk to human health or the environment, additional actions could be required by Ecology. We will consider and respond to all comments before making the documents final.

Treated wood products like utility poles and lumber for decking, fencing, and similar products have been made at the site since 1974. Environmental studies and interim site cleanup actions have been done over the past 20 years at this site. A Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study (RI/FS) was finalized in 2014. The RI/FS describes the type and extent of contamination, summarizes past work, and suggests additional cleanup actions.

*Cleanup Action Plan, SEPA determination, Consent Decree Amendment Available for Public Review and Comment* Ecology and the City of Tacoma propose to amend an existing consent decree for cleanup of Sites 8 and 9 of Tacoma's Redevelopment Properties.

These sites are at 1131 and 1119 Dock Street on the Thea Foss Waterway. Under this amendment, a draft cleanup action plan has been proposed and is available for public comment.

Sites 8 and 9 currently host a combination of public access and parking to the Foss Waterway Marina and vacant warehouse space. The redevelopment plan proposes turning the space into a mixed-use commercial and residential area, while continuing to provide public access.

Heavy, historical industrial use of the Thea Foss Waterway led to extensive pollution. Soil on these sites is contaminated with metals (arsenic, copper, lead, nickel), polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (cPAHs), and petroleum hydrocarbons. Metals (arsenic, copper, nickel) were also found in groundwater. The proposed cleanup action plan is designed to address this contamination.

Ecology invites you to review and comment on the periodic review for the Columbia Paint & Coatings site. We conduct a periodic review at least every five years after beginning cleanup at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act. The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions and to ensure continued protection of human health and the environment when institutional controls are used as part of a cleanup.

Investigations in 1993, 2006, and 2007 found that business conducted by Columbia Paint & Coatings left arsenic, lead, and mercury in soil at levels exceeding state standards. An environmental covenant filed in 2009 records that the site is limited to industrial use, and activities that would expose soil contaminants are prohibited.

The site is currently used by DeVries Moving Packing Storage as a warehouse and hub location for a moving service. Ecology visited the site on June 18, 2015, and found the cleanup actions appear to continue to be protective of human health and the environment.

Ecology will review comments received during the comment period and make recommendations for suggested changes. The periodic review will become final if no significant changes are made. An additional public comment period will be held if significant changes are made.

#### Site Proposed for Removal from Hazardous Sites List

Ecology proposes to remove the Broadview Service site from the Hazardous Sites List. The site is located at 12250 Greenwood Ave. N in Seattle.

The site had been contaminated with petroleum substances and was cleaned up during 1990 to 1995 by the property owners. The cleanup actions accomplished at that time were evaluated by Ecology through the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP). Ecology added the property to the Hazardous Sites List in 2013.

The site underwent a Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) and was ranked a 3 under the Washington Ranking Method. The ranking uses a scale of 1 to 5, where 1 represents the highest risk and 5 represents the lowest risk. This ranking estimates the potential threat to human health and the environment relative to other sites at that time in Washington.

The property was used for an automobile fueling and repair service station from 1923 until 1990. There were nine underground storage tanks that stored mostly gasoline, and small quantities of waste oil and heating oil. The facility included dispenser islands and a building that housed three service bays with hydraulic hoists, a workshop, and office space. Petroleum products associated with the operations of the facility were released into the soil and define the site.

The facility was demolished in 1990. Petroleum contamination in soil was discovered during removal of the underground storage tanks and reported to Ecology on March 1, 1990. Cleanup actions were performed on the property during 1990 to 1995. All structures of the facility were demolished and removed from the property including the underground storage tanks and service building.

The contaminated soil then was excavated (2,450 cubic yards) and stockpiled on the property. The excavated soil was subsequently treated over time on the property to remove the contamination utilizing soil-vapor extraction and land farming remediation methods. Confirmation samples collected from the excavation and also during the subsequent treatment of the excavated soil demonstrated that the soil contamination on the property were below state cleanup standards.

A three-story apartment building (Daniel Apartments) was built on the property during 1995. The building also includes a business office at street level, and a single-level underground parking garage. Ecology determined the site meets state cleanup standards for soil protective of human health and the environment. Ecology is proposing to delist this site from the Hazardous Sites List.

Agreed order - A legal agreement with Ecology to make sure the cleanup meets the standards of Washington State's cleanup law, the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA).

**Cleanup action plan (CAP)** - A document that describes the selected cleanup method(s) and specifies cleanup standards and other requirements. It is based on information and technical analyses generated during the RI/FS and consideration of public comments and community concerns. A draft of the CAP (DCAP) is made available for public review and comment before finalizing.

**Comment period** - A time period during which the public can review and comment on various documents and Ecology or EPA actions. For example, a comment period is provided to allow community members to review and comment on proposed cleanup action alternatives and proposed plans. Also, a comment period is held to allow community members to review and comment on draft feasibility studies.

**Consent decree** - A formal legal agreement that is filed with a court. It describes studies and/or cleanup work to be done at a site and the terms under which that work is to be done.

**Engineering design report** - Engineering design reports outline the specific details for implementation and operation of the first phase of the cleanup actions.

ERTS - Environmental Report Tracking System

**Five-year periodic review** - A periodic review is conducted at least every five years after the initiation of a cleanup action at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions, after cleanup is considered complete, and to ensure protection of human health and the environment.

**Hazardous Sites List** - A statewide list of contaminated properties. Ecology may remove a site from the list only after determining that all remedial actions except confirmational monitoring have been completed and compliance with the cleanup standards has been achieved at the site, or the listing was erroneous.

Independent cleanup action - Any remedial action without department oversight or approval and not under an order or decree.

LUST - Leaking Underground Storage Tank

NFA - No Further Action

**Public participation plan** - Outlines and describes the tools Ecology will use to inform the public about site activities, and it identifies opportunities for the community to become involved in this process.

**PSI** - Puget Sound Initiative

RCW - Revised Code of Washington

Remedial action - Construction work done to clean up a contaminated site.

**Remedial investigation/feasibility study -** Two distinct but related studies. They are usually performed at the same time, and together referred to as the "RI/FS."

RI/FS - See Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study

**SEPA** - State Environmental Policy Act

**Site Hazard Assessment (SHA)** - An assessment to gather information about a site to confirm whether a release of hazardous substances has occurred and to enable Ecology to evaluate the relative potential hazard posed by the release.

TCP - Ecology's Toxics Cleanup Program



UXO - Unexploded Ordnance

**Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP)** - The VCP is one of several options for cleaning up a hazardous waste site under the state's cleanup law. Under this option, property owners may perform a cleanup independently and request services from Ecology for a fee.

WAC - Washington Administrative Code

WARM, Washington Ranking Method - The method used to rank sites placed on the Hazardous Sites List.
