We invite you to comment on the proposed hazardous waste permit renewal for the Phillips 66 oil refinery in Ferndale.

Proposed permit

The proposed permit includes:

- Detailed requirements for storing the dangerous waste created (generated) by the refinery.
- Conditions for a long term container storage area.
- Corrective actions for cleaning up contamination.

Read the permit and its support documents (Fact Sheet and permit application) for more information.

Commenting

Effective comments tell us if we correctly applied current laws, rules, and regulations to this action. They:

- Are specific. Tell us what your concern is and how you think the permit should change.
- Are focused. Refer to the conditions and requirements in the permit. Relate the potential impacts to water quality from this action.
- Describe the state or federal rules and regulations you think have not been applied correctly.

When the comment period ends, we will review all comments received and make appropriate changes before finalizing the documents

If we determine there is significant public interest during this comment period to hold a hearing, we will extend the comment period to allow at least a 30 day notice of the hearing and publish the time, date and location.

Facility information

The refinery began operating in 1954 and has about 275 employees and 130 contractors that work on site. It processes crude oil into a variety of petroleum products. At full production, it is capable of processing an average of 105,000 barrels of crude oil each day.
