## Comment period: April 3 – May 10, 2019

We invite you to comment on proposed air quality Notice of Construction Order No. 16197 for the Nippon Dynawave pulp and paper mill in Longview to build a new piece of equipment called a pulp dryer.

## Project information

The pulp dryer would allow the mill to dry up to 525 air-dried metric tons each day of the pulp it produces.

The following air pollutants (emissions) are expected to increase because of the project.

- Particulate matter (PM) by 10.75 tons per year (tpy)
- PM above 10 microns in size (PM10) by 9.69 tpy
- PM2.5 by 9 tpy
- Sulfur dioxide by 0.23 tpy
- Nitrogen oxide by 12.86 tpy
- Carbon monoxide by 1.92 tpy
- Volatile organic compounds by 11.47 tpy
- Toxic air pollutants by 10.4 tpy

As long as all applicable requirements are met, these increases are allowed under air quality standards.

## Commenting

Effective comments tell us if we correctly applied current laws, rules, and regulations to this action. They:

- Are specific. Tell us what your concern is and how you think the order should change.
- Are focused. Refer to the conditions and requirements in the order. Relate to the potential impacts from this action.

- Describe the state or federal rules and regulations you think have not been applied correctly.

When the comment period ends, we'll review the comments received and make a final decision, which may include changes to the order.

## Will there be a public hearing?

We will hold a public hearing if there is significant interest from the public to do so. Requests for a hearing on the order must be in writing and received by April 26, 2019. Send your request to:

If we determine there is significant public interest to hold a hearing, we will hold it:

If no timely requests for a hearing are received or if we determine there is not a significant degree of public interest, we will cancel the hearing and post notice of the cancellation on our website.

At a hearing, you may submit oral and/or written comments on the draft order. We will not respond to comments during the event. You do not need to attend a hearing to submit written comments, and written comments and supporting information submitted during the comment period is considered with the same weight of importance as any oral comments presented during a hearing. When we make a final decision, we will provide a written response to all written and oral comments received on the draft order during the comment period.

## Facility information

Located at 3401 Industrial Way in Longview, the pulp and paper mill produces liquid packaging paperboard, and wetlap and slush pulp.
