No Further Action Determination

The Sears Auto Center Heating Oil Tank cleanup Site is located at 2759 1st Avenue South, Seattle, WA 98134. The Site was a former automotive service center. It is currently a rock climbing gym called Momentum Indoor Climbing.

The Department of Ecology (Ecology) has determined that the site meets cleanup standards and is proposing to remove the Site from the Hazardous Sites List (HSL).

If no significant comments are received, Ecology will delist the Site from the HSL.



Site Background

In 1992, a 2,500-gallon underground heating oil tank was removed from the property during construction of the new Sears Automotive Center building. Soil samples collected from the tank area did not contain total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) above cleanup levels. Additional soil samples collected on the property in 1994 also did not contain TPH above cleanup levels.



The Site was reported to Ecology when it briefly entered the Voluntary Cleanup Program in 2007-2008. No cleanup activities occurred at that time. However, the Site was added to the Confirmed and Suspected Contaminated Sites List due to the potential for impacts to shallow groundwater.

In November 2016, two monitoring wells were installed at the Site to collect groundwater samples. Samples were collected and analyzed four times in 2016-2017. Sampling occurred every three months. TPH was not detected in any groundwater sample.

Hazardous Sites Ranking

In 2013, Ecology completed an SHA on this Site. An SHA allows us to rank the potential threat to human health and the environment relative to other sites in Washington State. Rankings are on a scale of 1 to 5, where 1 represents the highest potential threat and 5 represents the lowest potential threat. This Site originally received a rank of 5, based on suspected groundwater contamination, and was added to the HSL. The HSL is available twice a year. It includes sites added or removed from the list, and changes in remedial status.

The 2016-2017 sampling event provided data that was missing in the 2013 SHA. Ecology updated the SHA in 2018 to include this new data and concluded that the Site does not pose a threat to human health and the environment using the criteria established in the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). Instead of a numerical ranking, it received a recommendation for No Further Action and a proposal for removal from the HSL.
