We invite you to comment on the changes to the Air Operating Permit for the Nippon Dynawave pulp and paper mill in Longview.

Changes to the permit

We propose to modify the mill's air operating permit with changes that include:

- Changing the classification of a piece of equipment called the lime kiln auxiliary drive motor from an emergency engine to a non-emergency engine.
- Adding the requirements from pulp dryer Notice of Construction Order 16197 that we accepted comments on from April 3 – May 10, 2019. We finalized this order on May 16, 2019.
- Administrative changes.

Air quality impacts

No new or additional pollution is allowed by the proposed changes to the permit.

Commenting
