## **Time to Update the State Waste Plan**

It's time to update the State Solid and Hazardous Waste Plan: Moving Washington Beyond Waste and Toxics. Similar to how local governments are required to update their solid waste plans every five years, the state tries to do the same. We created a first draft of the five-year update\_(and would like your input. You can provide input on our website.

Comments are due January 15, 2021.

## **Background**

The 2015 plan took a fresh look at the 2004 and 2009 plans. Based on significant input from interested parties, we significantly changed the plan structure and content. We adopted a sustainable materials management approach and established the following five plan sections, each with goals and actions:

- Managing Hazardous Waste & Materials (includes Moderate Risk Waste)
- Managing Solid Wastes & Materials (includes organics)
- Reducing Impacts of Materials & Products
- Measuring Progress
- Providing Outreach & Information

## What's Changing?

While the direction outlined in the 2015 plan is still helpful and needed, the waste world changed over the past five years.

The recycling system changed in response to export markets no longer accepting commingled recyclables. Concerns about plastics, food waste, climate change, toxic chemicals and products, and Puget Sound health have grown. The Washington Legislature implemented new laws in some of these areas.

This update addresses these realities as well as continuing the unfinished work from the 2015 plan.

#### What's Next?

Following the public comment period, we will address comments and publish a second draft for final public input. The second draft will include additional content, such as an introduction and a glossary. We expect to publish the final version of the State Solid and Hazardous Waste Plan in 2021.
