Site-description

The town of Kosmos was flooded with water in 1968 to create Riffe Lake. Currently, the surrounding land and water are used for recreational activities such as boating, camping and a hang-gliding landing area.

In April 2019, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) was notified about seeps of Bunker C oil found on the eastern bank of Rainey Creek near Champion Haul Road southeast of Morton, Washington. The seeps are located at the site of a former Kosmos lumber mill near Riffe Lake within the boundaries of <u>Tacoma Power's Cowlitz River Project</u> (https://www.mytpu.org/community-environment/fish-wildlife-environment/cowlitz-river-project/).

Possible sources for the seeps are from former sawmill operations, including old underground storage tanks and piping, or petroleum-impacted soil.

Public comment

May 25, 2020 to June 23, 2020.

Ecology invites comments on a legal agreement called an Agreed Order. The Agreed Order requires Tacoma Power to study the contamination near Riffe Lake and prepare the following cleanup reports:

- A remedial investigation, which describes the types and extent of contamination.
- A feasibility study, which considers and compares cleanup options.
- A preliminary cleanup action plan, which describes cleanup methods selected by Ecology.

A Public Participation Plan (PPP) is also available for comment. The plan describes how Ecology will inform the community about site activities and opportunities to engage in the process.

The Agreed Order and the PPP can be reviewed on Ecology's website.

Contamination

As an emergency cleanup action, Tacoma Power capped the seeps to keep oil from moving into Rainey Creek. They collected soil and groundwater samples from test pits and soil borings. Other contamination found include diesel, gasoline, and heavy oil.

Contact with these hazardous substances can be harmful to human health and the environment. Tacoma Power has closed the area to protect the public until cleanup is complete.

Next steps

After the comment period ends, Ecology will respond to any comments in a responsiveness summary. Then, Tacoma Power will write the cleanup reports. These documents will be made available by Ecology for public comment.
