Cleanup Action Plan ready for review

The Department of Ecology (Ecology) invites you to review a draft cleanup action plan and associated documents for the Chlor-Alkali Area of the Georgia-Pacific West site on the Bellingham waterfront. The plan calls for treating, removing, and capping contaminated soil; treating and monitoring groundwater; and restricting future activities in certain areas.

Documents available for review and comment: July 6 – August 4, 2021

- **Cleanup Action Plan:** Ecology's plan that describes the cleanup work to address contamination at the Chlor-Alkali Area of the site.
- **Agreed Order Amendment:** Legal agreement between Ecology and the Port of Bellingham (Port) requiring design of the work described in the cleanup action plan. The Port will sequence this design through four separate projects.
- **State Environmental Policy Act-Determination of Non-Significance:** Ecology determination that the cleanup work is not likely to harm the environment.
