#### Normal conditions

Water supply is within normal range. Experts are watching conditions. Report any dry conditions in your area.

#### **Drought advisory**

Drought conditions may develop in the future. Conserve water and report dry conditions in your area. Watch for further information.



## Drought emergency

Water supply is likely below 75 percent of average. There is a risk of undue hardship to water users. Emergency relief may be available. Take steps to conserve water and follow local guidelines.

## Immediate tips to conserve water



## Reduce indoor water use

- 1. Make sure your home is leak free and repair leaks.
- 2. Use dishwashers and washing machines only when full.
- 3. Limit shower time to five minutes or less.
- 4. Avoid flushing toilets unneccesarily.
- 5. Compost food instead of using the garbage disposal.

# Learn more and get involved



#### Reduce outdoor water use

- 1. Save watering for plants while letting your grass go dormant.
- 2. Follow special lawn watering schedules from your utility.
- 3. Use a broom to clean driveways.
- 4. Wash cars at a carwash, where water is recycled.
- 5. Plant native, drought-resistant plants.
- Commit to conserving water for current and future generations.
