Our Safer Products for Washington program asked for community and public input through a survey that closed in January 2022.



392 people completed our survey.







95% are concerned about toxic chemicals in products.

Washingtonians who responded worry about many products.

HOW WE'LL USE YOUR INPUT

We'll use the insights you shared in this survey in multiple ways.



You gave us ideas for a new list of products to consider in the next Safer Products for Washington cycle. For products we have authority to consider, we'll work to figure out:

- If they contain harmful chemicals.
- If safer alternatives can replace the toxic chemicals.
- Whether we need to regulate them in the future.

Many respondents wanted more information about safer options. We heard you! Your feedback helps us prioritize the educational resources we create.

As a first step, we launched a <u>webpage</u> <u>with tips</u>¹ to reduce your exposure to harmful chemicals and purchase safer products. Check it out and <u>email our team</u>² if you have thoughts to share!





We don't think our current authority allows us to take some of the actions you mentioned. We can't regulate certain products or create new labeling requirements. Instead, we'll:

- Share your feedback with the right people at Ecology and other government agencies.
- Gather educational resources on our <u>new webpage</u>.¹
- Encourage our industry partners to make voluntarily changes like increasing transparency in labeling.
