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Introduction

The Washington State Department of Ecology's Nuclear Waste Program (Ecology) manages State Waste Discharge Permits within the Hanford Site by writing permits to regulate discharge of wastewater to the waters of the state. When a new permit or a significant modification to an existing permit is proposed, Ecology holds a public comment period to allow the public to review the change and provide formal feedback. (See <u>Washington Administrative Code [WAC]</u> <u>173-216-090</u> for public notice requirements.)

The Response to Comments is the last step before issuing the final permit, and its purpose is to:

- Specify which changes, if any, of a permit will become effective upon issuance of the final permit, providing reasons for those changes.
- Describe and document public involvement actions.
- List and respond to all significant comments received during the public comment period and any related public hearings.

Reasons for Issuing the Permit

State Waste Discharge Permit ST0004500 (SWDP ST0004500) authorizes the U.S. Department of Energy (Energy) to discharge wastewater from the 200 Area Effluent Treatment Facility (200 Area ETF) to the ground at the State-Approved Land Disposal Site (SALDS). The wastewater is sourced from treated wastewater from the 200 Area Effluent Treatment Facility and non-contact process wastewater from the 200 Area ETF cooling tower blowdown and air compressor.

The SALDS has been in operation since 1995. The SALDS is a disposal site and does not treat wastewaters discharged to it. Wastewaters discharged to the 200 Area SALDS are required to already meet effluent limits set by the permit.

State Water Discharge Permit (SWDP) ST0004500 ensures that Energy operates the SALDS according to requirements of the Washington State Waste Discharge Permit Program. SWDP ST0004500 defines the authorized discharge sources, schedules for submittal of documents, effluent limits, monitoring, operations and maintenance, reporting and recordkeeping, etc.

Through strict source control and careful siting of the discharge location, there is little risk of driving contamination into the soil or groundwater or impacting historical, archaeological, and cultural resources.

The siting of the SALDS was chosen for its relative isolation from the Columbia River. This allows tritium present in the discharged wastewater to decay in the groundwater beneath the site before it has the potential to reach the Columbia River.

Public Involvement Actions

We encouraged public comment on the permit and fact sheet during a 30-day, public comment period held Aug. 8 – Sept. 9, 2022.

We took the following actions to notify the public:

- Mailed a public notice announcing the comment period to 973 members of the public.
- Placed a public announcement legal classified notice in the Tri-City Herald on Aug. 7, 2022.
- Emailed a notice announcing the start of the comment period to the Hanford-Info email list, which has 1,374 recipients.
- Posted the comment period notice on the Washington Department of Ecology Hanford's Facebook and Twitter pages.

Attachment 1: Comments and Responses

Description of comments:

Ecology accepted comments from Aug. 8 – Sept. 9, 2022. This section provides a summary of comments that we received during the public comment period and our responses, as required by RCW 34.05.325(6)(a)(iii). Comments are grouped by individual, and each comment is addressed separately.

I-1: ANONYMOUS

Comment I-1-1

1. DOE is Weakening the Chosen Tritium SALOS Disposal Path

Page 9 of the Fact Sheet notes that "the chosen alternative for handling tritium in the 200 Area ETF-treated effluent is to discharge the effluent underground and allow tritium to beta decay into non-radioactive helium before it reaches the Columbia River."

The most recent available review, "2022 EVALUATION OF TRITIUM REMOVAL AND MITIGATION TECHNOLOGIES FOR WASTEWATER TREATMENT, DOE/RL-2022-09, also states: *Tritium in this effluent is mitigated by storage in slow-moving groundwater to allow extended time for radioactive decay before the water reaches the Columbia River site boundary. By this method, tritium in the state-approved land disposal site is <u>isolated from the general environment</u> and human contact until it has decayed to acceptable drinking water standard levels.*

The draft discharge permit does not mention the new steam stripping equipment at ETF, which will <u>reduce the facility's ability to dispose of tritium through the soils (the preferred process</u>). The consequences of installing the steam stripper are that tritium will now be discharged to the air instead of managed in the soil column. This is contrary to creating isolation from the environment and human contact. Why was this equipment allowed when it damages the SALOS facility's purpose? The steam stripping equipment causes a change from O Ci/year released to the air during prior operating experience to a projected release of more than 3 Curies per year of tritium up the ETF stack. This is contrary to ALARA. Ecology should look at whether the appropriate ALARA review was performed for the new design and steam stripping operations, which will reduce the effectiveness of the SALDS as a disposal path.

2. Sampling for Acetonitrile/VOCs Before Disposal

The draft permit does not mention acetonitrile. However, Table 2 of the FACT sheet notes a wastewater characterization of a maximum of 30 micrograms per liter (30 ppb) of acetonitrile. The draft permit does not mention the new steam stripping equipment being installed for concentrating a portion of the acetonitrile to be newly produced by the WTP vitrification. As a result, Ecology should consider sampling treated effluent for acetonitrile before discharging it to the SALDS, to ensure separations are acceptable. Is 30 ppb a regulatory limit for acetonitrile? Will operations including the new WTP effluent exceed 30 ppb in the wastewater?

The anticipated new organics to be discharged to ETF are listed in a Table on Page A-2 of HNF-8306, Rev 1, "Waste Treatment Plant Liquid Effluent Treatability Evaluation," September 2004. The table includes 100 lb/day of acetonitrile, plus other volatile organics. Can Ecology also consider whether sampling should be required for any other new waste constituents? Table 3 on page 29 of RPP-RPT-62739, "Basis of Preliminary Engineering Targets Set for Receipt of WTP EMF Wastewater at LERF/ETF to Support DFLAW Operations," September 15, 2020, shows that in addition to acetonitrile, acrylonitrile, 2-Butoxyethanol, Cresol (m, o, p), Aroclors (Total PCB), NNItrosomorpholine, N-Nitroso-N,N-dimethylamine, and 2-Butanone (MEK) exceed engineering targets for acceptance to ETF. Each may be something that needs monitoring. Thank you for considering these comments.

Response to I-1-1

Thank You for your comment.

1. The purpose of the SALDS facility is to discharge waste water streams generated by the 200 Area ETF to the ground. The wastewater must meet the conditions of this permit which includes limits for multiple constituents. The treatment of these waste water streams is regulated under the Hanford Dangerous Waste Permit. Discharge of tritium to air is regulated by the Washington State Department of Health. The effectiveness of the SALDS as a disposal path for waste water streams generated by the 200 Area ETF is not reduced by the addition of the ETF steam stripper.

2. Special Condition S11. Treated Waste Compliance for the Waste Treatment Plant, includes requirements for sampling of wastewaters for potential new or increased constituents as a result of the WTP effluent. Results of the required sampling will determine any updates to permit limits that are necessary. These updated limits will be implemented either in a permit modification or in the next permit renewal depending on when the 200 Area ETF begins accepting WTP effluent. In WAC 173-200-040, there is no groundwater quality criteria listed for acetonitrile.

I-2: STEVEN CLARK

Comment I-2-1

Why does Ecology persist in inserting language regarding "publicly owned treatment works" (POTW) into Hanford Site permits and fact sheets? The Hanford Site does not contain a POTW and no Hanford Site wastewater is routed to a POTW. General Condition G4 of the Permit contains the following absurd statement: "The Permittee must obtain the written concurrence of the receiving publicly owned treatment works (POTW) on the application before submitting it to Ecology." This is confusing nonsense and should be stricken from the Permit. Likewise, referrals to a POTW should be removed from the Fact Sheet.

Response to I-2-1

Thank You for your comment. Ecology acknowledges that there is no likelihood of any of the LERF & ETF wastewater or any of the wastewater discharged to SALDS being routed to a POTW. The General Conditions of the permit are requirements included in all State Waste Discharge Permits for Washington State. A definition for a POTW is provided in the Fact Sheet because POTWs are discussed in General Condition G4.

Background

The Hanford Site occupies 580 square miles in southeastern Washington State. The site produced plutonium for the nation's defense program from 1943 to the late 1980s. Today, waste management and environmental cleanup are the primary missions at Hanford.

Overview & Changes

Energy applied to renew SWDP ST0004500 for the SALDS.

Ecology reviewed this application and drafted the permit in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 90.48 Revised Code of Washington and Chapter 173-216 Washington Administrative Code.

After developing the draft permit, Ecology made a tentative determination on the special permit conditions that will prevent and control pollution of the groundwater.

The main changes to this permit are the addition of a condition which will require Energy to evaluate the treated wastewater sourced from the proposed influent from the Waste Treatment Plant Direct-Feed Low-Activity Waste Facility (WTP DFLAW) commissioning and a condition which adds limits and monitoring in the groundwater at the SALDS groundwater monitoring wells.

Ecology will not make a final determination until we evaluate all comments received during this public comment period.



Facility Background

The SALDS is located north of the 200 West Area. The SALDS transfer line runs from the 200 Area Effluent Treatment Facility (200 Area ETF) in the 200 East Area to the SALDS infiltration field. All discharges to the SALDS are sourced from treated wastewater and nontreated, noncontact wastewater from the 200 Area ETF. Energy is required to ensure that all treated wastewaters meet the effluent limits in this permit before discharging to SALDS and that the Groundwater Water Quality Standards are protected in the groundwater at SALDS.

The 200 Area ETF influent consists of individual waste streams from many Hanford facilities. Major sources include process condensate (PC) from the 242-A Evaporator, leachate from land waste disposal sites, and the proposed influent from the WTP DFLAW commissioning.



SWDP ST0004500 was initially issued on June 30, 1995, and was last renewed on Dec. 11, 2014.
