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Washington Cap-and-Invest Program APCR Auction #2 November 2023 Summary Report

Issued on November 15, 2023

Background

Ecology held an auction of allowances on November 8, 2023. The auction included the sale of vintage-less allowances from the Allowance Price Containment Reserve (APCR) account, sold at a single tier price.

Prior to today's certification of APCR #2, Ecology staff and the independent market monitor evaluated bids and determined that the auction process and procedures complied with the requirements of the Washington Regulation. The Market Monitor made the following determination:

The Market Monitor found that the November APCR auction was cleared consistent with the APCR auction clearing rules in the Regulations. The Market Monitor confirmed the clearing quantities by qualified bidder. The auction algorithm correctly applied requirements of the Regulations covering the bid guarantee. The Market Monitor did not observe any breaches of communication protocols.

The Market Monitor recommends that ECY approve the November APCR Auction results.

The Financial Services Administrator will distribute auction proceeds to the State of Washington after all qualified bidder payments are received. Ecology will release the APCR Auction Proceeds Report on December 6, 2023, providing the final amount of proceeds generated from APCR Auction #2.

Auction Results

A total of 5,000,000 APCR allowances were offered at auction, solely at tier 1. All allowances offered for sale by Ecology were sold. Only covered and opt-in entities were eligible to participate, and consignment of allowances was not permitted.

^{*}Herfindahl-Hirschman Index (HHI) is a measure of market concentration and competitiveness, the values of which range from 0 to 10,000. A lower HHI value indicates a higher level of competition. A higher HHI value indicates greater market concentration among fewer entities.
