## Safer Products for Washington Cycle 1: Adopted Rule Highlights



The <u>Safer Products for Washington program</u><sup>1</sup> implements a law designed to reduce the use of toxic chemicals in consumer products. The program may restrict toxic chemicals when safer alternatives are available or may require reporting the toxic chemicals when safer alternatives are not available. This document provides highlights of the Safer Products for Washington program's new adopted rule. The table includes specific elements of the rule, like restrictions and reporting requirements.

## Highlights of the new adopted rule

The new Safer Products Restrictions and Reporting rule (Chapter 173-337 WAC):<sup>2</sup>

- Requires restrictions on 10 chemical-product combinations.
- Requires reporting for 4 chemical-product combinations.
- Makes allowances for existing stock, repair parts, and replacement parts depending on manufacture date.
- Allows regulated entities to apply for an exemption from rule requirements.

\* The effective dates for electric and electronic products with plastic external enclosures, intended for indoor use, are:

- Jan. 1, 2025, for televisions and displays.
- Jan. 1, 2027, for other products manufactured, sold, or distributed by entities with sales greater than or equal to one billion dollars gross sales in 2022 (Group 1).
- Jan. 1, 2028, for other products manufactured, sold, or distributed by entities with sales less than one billion dollars gross sales in 2022 (Group 2).
