We released a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) about the collection and disposal of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF), used by municipal fire departments to extinguish liquid fuel-based fires. AFFF contains per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), which are toxic chemicals that can contaminate soil, surface water, groundwater, and drinking water.

As directed by the Washington State Legislature, we're developing a program to assist municipal fire departments with the safer disposal of unused AFFF. **The DEIS** will help us determine a safer alternative for disposal.

Public Hearing


A formal online hearing where you can submit verbal or written public comments on the DEIS, following a brief overview by Ecology staff. We'll collect formal public comments for the DEIS record.
