Children's Safe Products Act

The Children's Safe Products Act (or CSPA) law applies to children's products—including children's cosmetics—sold in Washington state. **Learn more at ecology.wa.gov/CSPA or scan this QR code.**



CSPA does the following:

- Limits the presence of these priority toxic chemicals:
 - Lead
 - Cadmium
 - Phthalates (6 types)
 - Di-(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP)
 - Dibutyl phthalate (DBP)
 - Benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP)
 - Diisononyl phthalate (DINP)
 - Diisodecyl phthalate (DIDP)
 - Di-n-octyl phthalate (DnOP)
 - Flame retardants (5 types)
- Requires manufacturers to report if their children's products contain chemicals of high concern to children (WAC 173-334-130).



Chemicals of high concern to children

Children's product manufacturers are required to report each year if their products contain Chemicals of High Concern to Children (CHCC list), including formaldehyde, PFAS, specific parabens, specific phthalates, specific phenols, certain heavy metals and 1,4 Dioxane. **For the specific list of restricted and reportable chemicals with CAS RN and rationale, visit ecology.wa.gov/HighConcernChemicals or scan this QR code.**
