


WHAT IS A PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD?



GENERAL PROCESS

A public comment period (PCP) is the range of time the public has to submit input before an agency makes a final decision on a proposed rule or modification.

Ecology's Nuclear Waste Program (NWP) primarily has PCPs for permit modifications or permit renewals related the Hanford Site.

Before the comment period begins

- The permit team determines if a permit needs to be modified or renewed.
- The permit team drafts the modification or renewal.
 - This team might be the permittee, NWP staff, or both
- Regulations determine minimum amount of days required for a comment period, based on type (30, 45, 60, etc).
- Regulations also determine the ways the public must be notified.

Comment period starts

- Comments are collected.
- Regulations determine when a hearing or public meeting is required.

Comment period ends

- All the comments are collected and reviewed.
- The draft permit can be modified based on comments.
- The permit team responds to the comments.
- A response to comments document is developed.
- Final permit issued with response to comments.
- There is a 30 day window for appeal.
- If there is no appeal, work begins!

WHY IT MATTERS

- A chance to make your voice heard.
- Commenting is an opportunity to influence or change the permit modification or renewal.
- Commenting makes better permits.
- Public comment ensures a transparent process with balanced input from interested parties.
- Hanford cleanup decisions impact the public.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Anyone can submit comments concerning permit modifications or renewals.
- Comments can influence the agencies' actions.
- Public comments can offer ideas and concerns not considered by the agencies.
