

Compostable Product Labeling and Declarations

Updates to Washington's Plastic Product Degradability Law

Overview

The Plastic Product Degradability Law (<u>Chapter 70A.455 Revised Code of Washington</u> (RCW)) sets marketing claim standards for compostable products sold in Washington State. The law requires labeling and declarations for compostable products. These requirements will reduce misleading, confusing, and deceptive labeling practices.

THIS LAW APPLIES TO THESE COMPOSTABLE PRODUCTS SOLD IN WASHINGTON

- Film bags and film products
- Food packaging
- Food service products

PRODUCTS LABELED WITH THESE TERMS ARE PROHIBITED FROM SALE IN WASHINGTON

- "biodegradable"
- "degradable"
- "decomposable"
- "oxo-degradable"
- any similar term

Seven Things to Know

Products labeled as "compostable" that are sold, offered for sale, or distributed in Washington must:

- Meet ASTM D6400 or D6868 specs or be made of wood
- Meet U.S. FTC guide labeling requirements
- Feature labeling that meets industry standards for being distinguishable
- Use a third-party certification logo
- Display the word "compostable"
- Use green, beige, or brown labeling, striping, or other patterns that help differentiate compostable items from non-compostable
- Be included on the compliance declaration provided to Ecology

Important Dates

JANUARY 1, 2024

- Producers must meet labeling requirements.
- Producers submit product declarations.

JULY 1, 2024

- Ecology's public complaint form available.
- Ecology will enforce requirements in consultation with local jurisdictions.

Compostable Products Declaration

By January 1, 2024, product producers required to meet the labeling requirements must submit a one-time declaration via Ecology's portal. The producer must declare, under penalty of perjury, that the product meets the standards established for that product. A new declaration is required after January 1, 2024:

- Before a compostable product is newly sold or distributed into Washington OR
- Before a product that has been materially changed is sold or distributed into Washington

Non-compostable Products

Manufacturers or suppliers of products that do not meet ASTM standards are:

- PROHIBITED from using tinting, labeling and terms that are required for products that meet the ASTM standards
- DISCOURAGED from using coloration, labeling, images, and terms that confuse consumers into believing that noncompostable items are compostable
- ENCOURAGED to use coloration, labeling, images, and terms that help consumers identify non-compostable items as recyclable or waste
