

# Quarter 1, 2023 Data Summary

## Clean Fuel Standard

This report is a summary of the total number of deficits and credits generated by program participants during quarter 1 of 2023 and is generated using data submitted by program participants. For this reason, there may be changes to the data as Ecology continues to work with regulated parties on corrections to their initial reporting. In all future quarterly data summaries, Ecology will post data from the most recent quarter as well as a summary of all previous quarters with updated values resulting from corrections.

**Figure 1** shows the number of credits and deficits generated. Credits are generated by fuels whose carbon intensity falls below this year's target, while deficits are generated by fuels whose carbon intensity is higher than this year's target. 275,442 credits were generated in the first quarter versus 227,768 deficits.

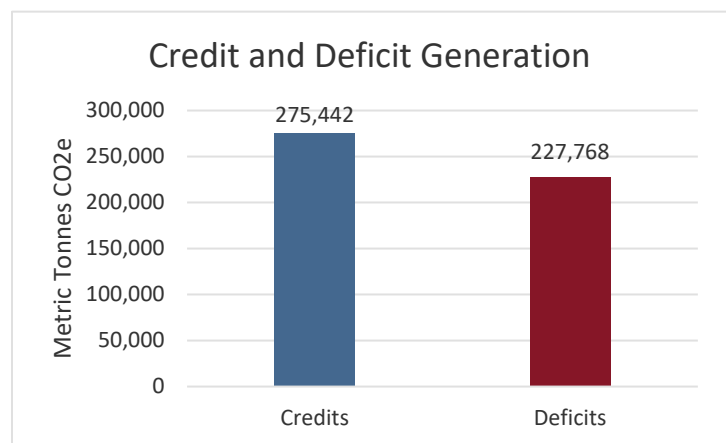


Figure 1. Total number of credit and deficits generated during Q1 and the metric tonnes of CO2 they represent.

**Figure 2** shows the breakdown of credit generation by fuel type during the first quarter. Each of these fuels were reported with a carbon intensity score below the 2023 standard. The category labeled 'other' represents propane and natural gas, which fall below the 2023 target.

Over 90 businesses reported to Ecology in the first quarter of 2023.

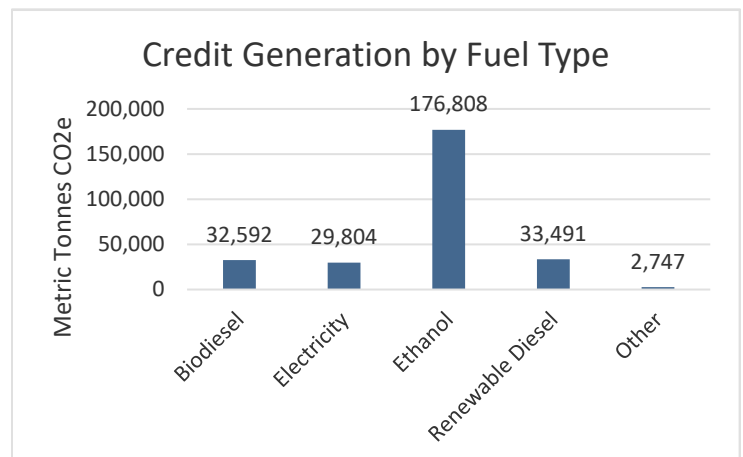


Figure 2. Fuels reported in the first quarter with a Carbon intensity below the 2023 standard.
