



Focus on: New Air Quality in Overburdened Communities Grants

Overview

Ecology is launching a \$10-million grant program to support air quality and environmental justice work under the Climate Commitment Act.

This new grant program is funded by the <u>Climate</u> <u>Commitment Act</u> and will support locally led projects to improve air quality and protect public health in overburdened communities highly impacted by air pollution.

The grant application period will be open **Aug. 29**, **2024**, through **Oct. 24**, **2024**.

Grants will be awarded by the end of 2024. The current grant project period runs through June 30, 2025. We expect to extend the project period for up to two years, although this is dependent upon Ecology receiving approval to extend the time to spend the funds.

The maximum grant award for this opportunity is \$700,000.

Eligible project types

Two types of projects are eligible to apply for grant funds:

- Planning and community engagement to develop projects that will reduce <u>criteria</u> air pollution.
- **Implementation** for projects that have already completed a community engagement process.

Projects that are **not** eligible include:

- Wildfire mitigation
- Air quality monitoring
- Projects addressing ultrafine particles

Eligible applicants

Eligible applicants include but are not limited to:

- Community-based organizations
- Local municipalities





Tribes¹ and entities that serve them

Ecology encourages collaborative applications for projects. However, only one organization will apply on behalf of the partnership and this organization will be responsible for meeting all grant deliverables and requirements.

How to apply for the grant

Applicants must apply online through Ecology's Administration of Grants and Loans (EAGL) platform. This requires registering for a Secure Access Washington account and an EAGL account. Instructions are available on our grant and loan webpage.
