

What can I do to protect my drinking water?



Test well water once a year. ¹



 Inspect the well for any damage — cracks, holes.



 Only grow grass near wells.
 Plants with deep roots can damage your water lines.





 Install back-flow preventing valves on outside faucets.



Pump your septic system every 3-5 years.










 Take unneeded chemicals and motor oil to a recycling center.



 Don't pile yard waste, leaves, manure, or compost near your well.
