

Guidance for Ecology's Clean Energy Coordinated Process



Phase 1: Pre-application

Develop a clean energy project in Washington

Please request a pre-application meeting with **Ecology** as soon as possible. During the pre-application phase of Ecology's Clean Energy Coordinated Permit Process (CPP) we will ask you to consider the following topics early

in you	r project planning. Use the hyperlinked resources to learn more.
	Does your project meet the <u>definitions of clean energy</u> and <u>state standards for reducing greenhouse</u> <u>gas emissions</u> (GHG)?
	Are you required to use the EFSEC process?
	Did you review the <u>Comparison of Permitting Pathways Focus Sheet</u> and <u>CEC website</u> ?
Eng	agement and Consultation ¹
	Does your project have potential impacts to <u>Tribal rights, resources, and interests</u> ?
	Did you identify <u>federally recognized Tribes with lands and territories in Washington State</u> who could be affected?
	Have you identified features of the community and engaged with overburdened communities ² ?
	Did you reach out to state agencies (<u>ECY</u> , <u>WDFW</u> , <u>DNR</u> , <u>DAHP</u>) to discuss requirements for baseline studies and surveys for a site?
	Do you have information from local governments, <u>clean air agencies</u> , and other regional authorities about their requirements?
	Document and include the contacts (related to your project) that you made prior to working with Ecology.

	Have you written a thorough project and site description?
	Have you completed the <u>SEPA checklist</u> , listed likely <u>permits needed</u> , and documented how the project contributes to a reduction of GHGs?
	Have you planned or completed analytical and baseline studies?
Fed	eral Requirements ³
	Does the project need a federal license or permit, receive federal funding, and/or is it on federal lands? Have you contacted any federal agencies?
