



Recycle Your Used Oil

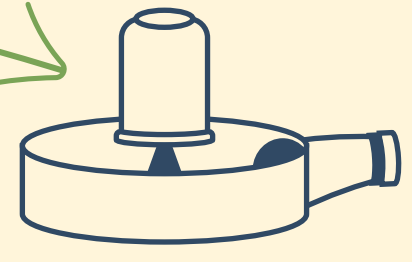


- 1. Gather supplies for an oil change**
- Crush washer
 - Oil filter
 - Oil
 - Absorbent material
 - Reusable oil collection container
 - Funnel
 - Shop towels
 - Oil filter wrench



- 2. Change your oil**
1. Use a simple, reusable oil collection container that is easy to fill and drain.
 2. Drain the oil carefully into the collection container, clean up any splatters or spills if they occur.

- 3. Drain the filter**
1. Drain your filter into your reusable oil collection container.
 2. Allow the filter to gravity drain for 24-36 hours.
 3. Once empty, filters can be placed into the waste can or set aside for scrap metal recycling.



- 4. Keep separate from other waste**
- Keep used oil free from other waste to prevent contamination. **Never** add anything such as brake cleaner, hydraulic fluid, or antifreeze to used oil. **Never** reuse these empty product containers for collecting used oil.



- 5. Find a collection facility**
- Use this QR code or contact your city/county solid waste program to locate a used oil collection facility.
- *Note: Many auto parts suppliers accept used oil.*

- 6. Drop off used oil**
1. Take used oil to a collection facility during normal business hours.
 2. Follow procedures at the drop-off location for proper transfer of used oil to their containers.
