Spokane Solid Fuel Burning Devices Rule and a Required Revision to the State Implementation Plan

Ecology is accepting public comment on a proposed State Implementation Plan (SIP) revision. The revision incorporates Spokane Regional Clean Air Agency's (SRCAA) current rule on solid fuel burning devices (like woodstoves, fireplaces, pellet stoves, and masonry heaters) into Washington's SIP. Ecology must submit this revision to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval.

Q: What is the State Implementation Plan (SIP)?

A: It is a tool for the EPA and the public to ensure the state and local clean air agencies do their job in safeguarding the air. States are required to develop a SIP to ensure the air is clean and meets the national standards. Washington's SIP is a compilation of:

- Ecology and local clean air agency rules.
- Technical data and analysis.
- Plans to clean up the air in areas of the state that do not meet national standards.

Q: How did the rule change?

A: The 2014 changes to the rule help improve air quality and meet federal air quality standards for particle pollution (PM10 and PM2.5) in Spokane County. The focus was to:

- Align the process for calling burn bans with Washington State law.
- Clarify the exemption criteria that allow the use of a solid fuel burning device during a burn ban.
- Meet EPA requirements.
- Improve air quality in areas affected by pollution from solid fuel burning devices.

National Air Quality Standards

EPA sets national air quality standards for six common pollutants. The standards are set to protect public health and welfare. Violations result in economic penalties to communities and can result in more federal intervention.

Much like cigarette smoke, wood smoke contains hundreds of air pollutants that can cause cancer and other health problems.





Infrastructure SIPs

When EPA establishes a new <u>National Ambient Air Quality Standard</u> (NAAQS) or revises an existing NAAQS, the federal <u>Clean Air Act</u> requires Washington to develop an infrastructure State Implementation Plan (SIP). The infrastructure SIP demonstrates that Washington has the necessary legal authority, regulatory structure, and sufficient resources to implement the NAAQS statewide.

Rule SIPS

Washington usually submits rules (Washington Administrative Codes or WACs) along with a SIP as enforceable means to carry out the control strategy in any type of SIP. Sometimes, rules are even submitted as standalone SIP revisions. When EPA approves a rule as part of Washington's SIP, the rule becomes "federally-enforceable." That is, if Washington does not implement the rule, EPA or citizens can step in and enforce the rule at the federal level.

EPA issued a clean air determination that the area was in attainment with the standard in 2001, and was officially redesignated as attainment in 2005. The updated local regulation is included in the proposed SIP revision to help the area stay in attainment with the federal PM10 standard.

Updating Current Spokane Solid Fuel Burning Devices Rules in the Washington State Implementation Plan

What is Ecology doing?

Ecology is accepting public comment on a proposed State Implementation Plan (SIP) revision. The revision incorporates Spokane Regional Clean Air Agency's (SRCAA) <u>current rule</u> on solid fuel burning devices (like woodstoves and pellet stoves) to Washington's SIP. Ecology must submit this revision to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval.

What is the State Implementation Plan?

It is a tool for the EPA and the public to ensure the state and local clean air agencies do their job in safeguarding the air. States are required to develop a SIP to ensure the air is clean and meets the national standards. Washington's SIP is a compilation of:

- Ecology and local clean air agency rules.
- Technical data and analysis
- Plans to clean up the air in areas of the state that do not meet national standards.

How did SRCAA's solid fuel burning device rule change?

The 2014 changes to the rule help improve air quality and meet federal air quality standards for particle pollution (PM10 and PM2.5) in Spokane County. The focus was to:

- Align the process for calling burn bans with Washington State Law.
- Clarify the exemption criteria that allow the use of a solid fuel burning device during a burn ban,
- Meet EPA requirements
- Improve air quality in the areas affected by pollution from solid fuel burning devices.

Why is Ecology proposing to submit this revised SIP for approval?

SRCAA's 1994 rule on solid fuel burning devices is currently included in Washington's SIP. SRCAA revised this rule, found in Regulation I, Article VIII, after a public comment period in 2014. The rule took effect September 2, 2014. Ecology is submitting the revised SIP for approval to meet EPA requirements and help the area meet health-based federal air quality standards.
